- Three full-time clinical experiences in facilities concentrated in the mid-Atlantic region, with additional sites outside the area.

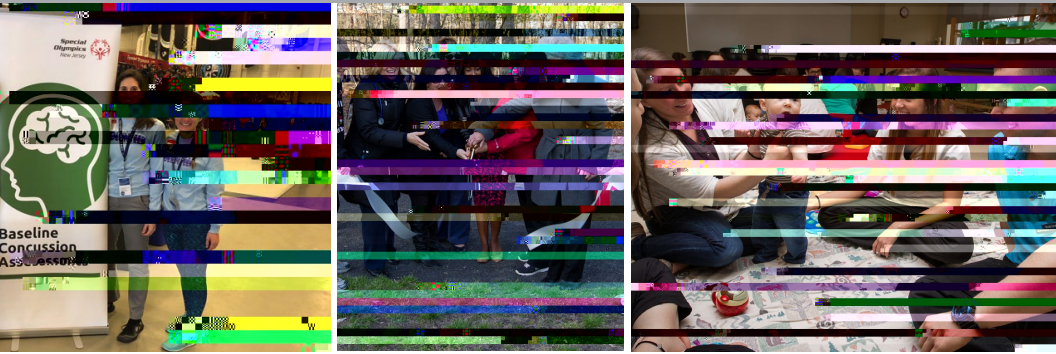
