

Symposium Wednesday at Richard Stockton College in Galloway Township to explore energy issues

More than 200 people are expected to attend the Energy Symposium scheduled to take place Wednesday at The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey in Galloway Township.

The event — which takes place from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the new Campus Center — is sponsored by the William J. Hughes Center for Public Policy.



This year's theme is "Energy 40/40: Looking Back 40 Years and Looking Forward 40 Years."

"This event puts energy industry leaders, experts and activists together in one room to discuss the energy issues facing New Jersey," Daniel Douglas, director of the Hughes Center, said.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Lisa Jackson is the keynote speaker for the event.

Topics for Wednesday's event include nuclear power, alternative energy and energy issues in building construction.
