**GALLOWAY TWP., NJ** – On Thursday, September 18, from 4:30 to 6:00 P.M. in the Performing Arts Center, the Richard Stockton College of New Jersey will host Pulitzer-prize winning journalist and Freshman Convocation speaker, **Charlie Savage**.

Mr. Savage, the author of *Takeover: The Return of the Imperial Presidency and the Subversion of American Democracy*, will speak about executive power and the presidency of George W. Bush. He will also discuss the upcoming election and its likely impact on the Supreme Court. This event will be followed by a book-signing.

Savage's work on the Bush-Cheney administration's signing statements and other efforts to expand presidential power has been widely recognized. In addition to winning the 2007 Pulitzer Prize for National Reporting, he has received the American Bar Association's Silver Gavel Award and the Gerald R.
